Happy New Year!

I would like to express my gratitude to everyone for this new year of 2023.

From “immigration to Brazil” to “permanent residence in Japan”

Since 1908, around 260,000 Japanese have immigrated to Brazil, and currently, including the sixth generation, 1.9 million Japanese descendants live there.

In 1990, with the revision of the Immigration Control Law, second and third-generation Japanese were allowed to come and work in Japan.

At the time, Brazil was experiencing hyperinflation and the number of people who came to Japan until 2007 was around 320,000 people.

At that time, Brazilians sent money to their families in Brazil, saved money to open a business or bought farms and returned to Brazil.

In 2008, many people lost their jobs due to the 2008 crisis and returned to Brazil, but the number of workers returning to Japan increased in 2016 due to the shortage of labor in Japan and the recession in Brazil.

After that, there was a change with Brazilians in Japan, with students graduating from high school and university in Japan, people naturalizing as Japanese, people buying houses, and workers ceasing to be *dekasegui* and becoming permanent residents.

To live in Japan with peace of mind, you need to acquire correct knowledge regarding taxes, Shakai Hoken, visa period, etc., and I want to continue to support them so that everyone can coexist and prosper.

FUTURO Shuurou Keizoku Shien B gata (Type B Recognized Institution)

In December 2022, we received authorization from Hamamatsu City for the Social Integration Support Department which started activities in April 2019.

The department was created for foreigners with disabilities who do not understand Japanese and do not know where to consult to become independent.

We also accept inquiries from people who do not have a disability booklet, as I believe it is Shin-Ei's role to create a comfortable living environment in Japan for everyone.

The name of the department carries the word FUTURE in Portuguese, as I would like to build a bright and hopeful future.

We will continue to work as a team so that as many people as possible say, "I'm glad I chose Shin-Ei."
